November 26.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of an application for a Nolle Prosequi in the case of Isaac Hayden, convicted of Bribery, in the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's county, at November term, 1861.

November 27.

The Governor pardoned Thomas Ray, convicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore, at September Term, 1861, of being a Rogue and a vagabond, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the term of two years; the Pardon being on the condition that he leave the State immediately and never return thereto.

November 29.

The Governor issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Frederick county for the arrest and delivery to Stephen Keepers of a certain Lewis Lloyd, a fugitive from the justice of the State of Pennsylvania.

November 30.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of the application for a nolle prosequi in the case of John K. Lovington, indicted in the Circuit Court for Worcester county, at October Term, 1861, for assault and battery.

December 3.

The Governor pardoned John Wilson alias George DeFord, convicted of Larceny in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county, at April term, 1860, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the term of eighteen months; said Pardon to take effect on the 6th instant.
