December 7.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the Pardon of Joseph Kuhn, convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at May term, 1860, and sentenced to the Penitentiary until July 1, 1869.

On the same day the Governor ordered notice to be given of application for a Nolle Prosequi in the case of Bobbin & Fulton, indicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore city, of Libel upon Milton Whitney.

On the same day the Governor made a Requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the delivery to the Sheriff of Baltimore county of a certain Joseph McGinnis, a fugitive from the justice of this State.

On the same day the Governor ordered notice to be given of the application for the pardon of Richard Roundtree, convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at January Term, 1861, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years.

December 9.

The Governor transmitted to the Senate a communication from the Department of State, at Washington, with a Memorial to the Senate signed by A. A. Lynch, the Senator from Baltimore county.

On the same day the Governor pardoned Adam Link, convicted of Larceny, in the Circuit Court for Howard county, at March term, 1859, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years and three months
