December 12.

The Governor transmitted to the House of Delegates communications from John B. Brooke contesting the right of Frederick Sarscer to hold the office of clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George's county, and from Robert J. Kerr contesting the right of J. Thomas Adams to hold the office of clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore city; and, also, the several returns of the election for said officers.

On the same day the Governor granted a nolle prosequi to Isaac Hayden, charged by the Grand Jury of Queen Anne's county with offering to bribe a voter.

December 13.

The Governor issued a Warrant to the Sheriff of Washington county for the delivery to John Eager of a certain Eugene Longemase, a fugitive from the justice of the State of Missouri.

December 16.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for a nolle prosequi in the case of Adam Freshore, indicted in the Circuit Court for Frederick county, at February term, 1860, for keeping a disorderly house.

December 17.

The Governor granted a nolle prosequi to Simon W. Boyer jr, presented by the Grand Jury of Kent county, for an assault and battery on William Coulby, by shooting him on the 5th of March, 1861.
