December 21.

The Governor pardoned Joseph Kuhn, alias Joseph Gardiner, convicted of murder in the second degree, by the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at September term, 1860, and sentenced to the Penitentiary until July 1, 1869.

December 26.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the pardon of John Rocas convicted in the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, at March term, 1857, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for nine years and five months.

On the same day, the Governor remitted the fine of Twenty-five dollars imposed upon Conrad Minnick, by William H. Reid, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Baltimore city, for peddling without License.

On the same day, the Governor transmitted to the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States, a copy of the Resolution of the General Assembly declaring the intention of the State of Maryland to assume her quota of the National Tax levied by the Act of August 6, 1861.

December 28

The Governor ordered notice to be given of the application for a nolle prosequi in the case of Edward Trice, indicted in the Circuit Court for Caroline county, at November Term, 1861, for forgery.

December 30.

The Governor remitted the fine of Fifty dollars imposed upon Ellen Picket
