The Governor appointed Thomas S. Alexander and Milton Whitney, counsel for the State in the case of the State vs. the Northern Central Railway company, now pending in the Court of Appeals.

On the same day, the Governor remitted the fine of Twenty five dollars, imposed upon Joseph Neilson, by John B. Wheat, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland in and for Baltimore city - for violating the 23rd section of Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws.

On the same day the Governor pardoned John Oliver, convicted in the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, at January term, 1856, of Assault with intent to kill; and sentenced to the Penitentiary for six years from the expiration of a previous sentence.
