On the same day the Governor remitted the fine of Twenty five Dollars imposed upon W. H. Wigenton, by W. H. Hebdern, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Baltimore city, for selling coal oil without license.

On the same day, in accordance with a Resolution of the General Assembly, the Governor commissioned the following gentlemen to "select such objects as will exhibit the skill, productions and resources of Maryland, at the International Exhibition of works of art and industry, to be held in London in 1862, - to wit: John P. Kennedy, John Hopkins, Peter W. Crain, Columbus E. Bonnell, Archibald Stirling, sr., Samuel P. Smith, Anthony Kimmel, Benjamin Hallowell, Clement Hill, A. B. Hagner, Robert Goldsborough, H. H. Goldsborough, Thomas A. Spence, John S. Farnell and James T. McCullough.

On the same day the Governor issued a Warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore city for the delivery to V. C. James of a certain Solomon Burnestune, a fugitive from the justice of the State of New York.
