

February 8th 1862

The Governor sent to the Senate a list of his nominations for certain civil officers - see Record of Executive nominations

February 10th

The Governor examined and approved the Bond of John Clark agent appointed by the State Treasurer. (Filed with Clerk of Court of Appeals.)

12th

The Governor issued his mandate to the Sheriff of Baltimore City for the arrest and delivery to James W. Morrison Agent, of Edward A. Bousy claimed by the Governor of Iowa as a fugitive from the justice of that State, charged with the crime of False pretences committed in the County of Johnson in that State.

February 13th

The Governor directs the usual notice of an application for pardon in the case of Lodowick Murray indicted in the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County at the November term 1861 for an assault and Battery upon his wife

February 19th

The Governor transmits to the Senate a list of his nominations for sundry local and general civil offices - see record of Executive appointments.

February 24th

The Governor sent a communication to the Senate nominating Joseph Taylor as an additional auctioneer for Baltimore City and asking leave to withdraw for further consideration the names of further auctioneers heretofore nominated - see record of Executive appointments

Same day the Governor received from the Senate a communication advising and consenting to the said withdrawals.

Same day the Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi to Frank P. Corbin (convicted at February term 1862 of Frederick County Circuit Court of Keeping a Prison)
