March 29th

The Governor approved the official Bond of Thomas Hughey Assistant Inspector of Flour in the City of Baltimore.

Same day approved official Bond of William Melah Inspector of Tobaccos at Warehouse No 4 in the City of Baltimore.

Same day approved official Bond of John Gephart Notary Public at Cumberland and directed his commission to issue. Issued accordingly.

Same day the Governor issued military commissions to Col. William J. Leonard of Pennells Legion and to Col D. J. De Witt of 3rd Regiment Maryland Volunteers. See record of Military Commissions.

Same day issued civil commissions to Messrs Chaplain, Jones Frazer and May Gram Inspectors in place of the former incumbents resigned. See record of Civil Commissions - general list.

March 31st

The Governor approved the official Bond of George Leaden State Wharfinger.

April 1st

The Governor approved the official Bond of David Ball Inspector and Weigher of Hay at the Western Scale in the City of Baltimore.

Same day the Governor, in the presence of the presiding officers and chief clerks of the Senate and House of Delegates signed sundry Bills passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at its late session, presented to him for his signature pursuant to the 34 section of the 3rd article of the Constitution.

April 2nd

The Governor directed the usual notice to be given (by publication in the Baltimore "American") of an application for pardon in the case of V. A. Goshier convicted of Larceny at the March term of the Circuit Court for Howard County and sentenced to imprisonment for 18 months in the Penitentiary.

Same day the Governor directed a warrant to issue for the admission of Charles E. Johnson into the Maryland Institution for the instruction of the Blind as one of the State Beneficiaries under the provisions of the Code. See Record of Bludge Page 203.

Same day approved the official Bond of Matthew S. Barber Notary Public at Hagerstown and directed his commission to issue. Issued accordingly.
