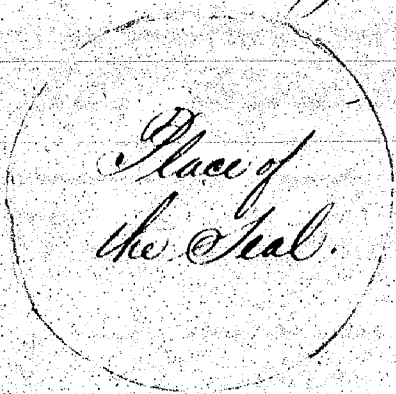

Same day the Governor re-commissioned Philip S. Smith as a Justice of the Peace of the 5th election District of Anne Arundel County, having inadvertently failed to qualify within the time prescribed by law.

Same day the Governor issued a Commission to Thomas H. Martin as assistant Inspector of Grain in the place of Thomas Rowles who failed to qualify.

Same day the Governor issued Commissions to Fielder Suit and Isaac L. Gheselin as Justices of the Peace in third district of Prince Georges County - see record of Executive appointments.

May 7th

In compliance with Resolution (No. 18) of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the January session 1862 the Governor issued a Commission to the Honorable Reverdy Johnson as Senator to represent this State in the Congress of the United States for six years from the fourth day of March eighteen hundred and sixty three.
