November 20th

The Governor remitted a fine of Fifty dollars, imposed on Adolph Maier by the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County for selling without a License.

November 25th

The Governor pardoned John Canty, convicted in the Circuit Court for Washington County at its July term 1862, of Assault and Battery and sentenced to confinement in the County Jail for one year and to pay a fine of five dollars and costs. At the same time the Governor remitted the fine aforesaid.

Same day the Governor appointed and commissioned Thomas Littleton of Worcester County as County Commissioner vice Neal S. Littleton deceased.

November 26th

The Governor pardoned Jacob Grove convicted in the Circuit Court of Frederick County at its February term 1862 of Larceny and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary for eighteen months.

November 29th

The Governor remitted the forfeited recognizance of A. E. Canter, Henry Canter and Levi Canter of Charles County for the appearance of said A. E. Canter before the Circuit Court for said County.

December 2nd

The Governor issued his requisition directed to the Honorable James Dunlop, Chief Judge of the Circuit Court for the District of Columbia for the arrest and delivery to John T. Baker Sheriff of Montgomery County of T. G. Dorney (alias Greenbury Dorney) a negro slave of Thomas A. Baker of Frederick County, Rachel A. Dorney a free negro of said County, Elias a slave of William Browning of Montgomery County, George Brooks a slave of Christian R. Kenney of said County and Sam Brooks slave of Lydia Kenney of said County, fugitives from the Justice of this State charged on affidavits with enticing sundry slaves to run away from their masters.
