December 13th

The Governor appointed and commissioned William A. M. Van Bokkelen as Commissioner of Deeds to reside in Virginia City, Nevada Territory.

Same day the Governor directed that John Henry Turner one of the State beneficiaries in the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf and Dumb be returned to his grandmother Mrs Anna Watkins 186 Conway street Baltimore upon an official report from the Director of said Institution that the said pupil is incapable of receiving education.

Same day the Governor directed the usual notice to be published of an application for Pardon in the case of Jacob Funk convicted at the October term 1860 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County of Murder in the 2nd degree and sentenced to the Penitentiary for nine years and five months. Notice sent to the "Frederick Examiner".

December 17th

The Governor directed the usual notice to be published of an application for Pardon in the case of John Wagner convicted at December term 1858 of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County of Burglary and sentenced to the Penitentiary for nine years and five months. Notice sent to the "American and Clipper".

December 22nd

The Governor in response to a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania issued his warrant to the Sheriff of Allegany County for the arrest and delivery of Lycurgus P. Gurley a Fugitive from the justice of Pennsylvania charged with Fornication and Bastardy.

Same day the Governor appointed Solomon A. Ecker Justice of the Peace for the 11th District of Carroll County vice Edwin A. Allen resigned.

December 23rd

The Governor remitted Fines in eight cases as follows viz. J. Wolfensaw - \$10 imposed by Circuit Court Howard County for selling liquor contrary to law

E. Johnston - 50 cts by same Court for Assault and Battery.

W. Savoy - \$5 " " " on a slave.
