Whereas information has been received that the Honorable James A. Pearce a Senator hitherto appointed from this State to the Senate of the United States hath lately departed this life: Know Ye that we reposing special trust and Confidence in the sound judgment discretion and integrity of the Honorable Thomas H. Hicks of the State of Maryland have appointed and commissioned him one of the Senators to represent the said State in the Congress of the United States in the place of the said James A. Pearce deceased to hold the said office from the date hereof until the next meeting of the general Assembly of the State agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of the United States and to the laws of the State of Maryland made in pursuance thereof

In Testimony whereof I Augustus W. Bradford Governor of the State of Maryland have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of the said State to be affixed at the City of Annapolis on this 29th day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and Sixty two and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty seventh
