does And thereupon the said Thomas Rutland Jun^r and the said James Bray appears
and being Demanded by the Court here what they had for themselves to say why
Judgment according to Law of and upon the promises and Verdict aforesaid ag^t
them ought to be rendered to suffer Death. Pray the benefit of their Bergey
in this behalf to be allowed them which is granted.

Therefore it is considered by the Justices here the day and year
last mentioned that the said Thomas Rutland Jun^r and James Bray be bodily
burnt in the Crown of the Thumb of the **Left** Hand with the Letter M according
to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided be.

And thereupon command is given to the said Sher^{iff} of Run Arundell County
that of the Judgment aforesaid as aforesaid rendered **Against** the said
Thomas Rutland Jun^r and James Bray, he doo Immediate Execution before the
Court here. of which said precept the said Sher^{iff} in Open Court before the
Justices here of made Execution according to the Direction thereof

and thereupon the said Thom^s. Rutland and Jam^s. Bray are disch^{arged} from the promises of

Ordered that Thomas Rutland Jun^r give recognizance in fifty pounds
current Money himself with two Sureties in twenty five pounds each for his
the said Thomas Rutland Jun^r keeping the peace and being of good behavior
for twelve Months and a day from this 25th of Oct^{ober} 1722

Thereupon the said Thomas Rutland Jun^r doo acknowledge himself to be
and stand Justly Judged unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietor in the sum of
fifty pounds Curr^{ent} Money.

Like wise Thom^s. Rutland Sen^r and Stephen Mason
both of Run Arundell County his Sureties acknowledge themselves to be
and stand Justly Judged unto his said Lordship in the sum of twenty five pounds
the money and each and either of them do acknowledge that the said several
sums shall be levied upon their and either of their bodies goods and Chattels
Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs & Successors.

In case the said Thomas Rutland Jun^r shall not keep the
(peace)
