May 6. By Order from the Governor Dead Warrant issued for the Execution of Negro Corra condemned last Ball County犯者, with a cause therin inserted to hang the Negro in chains at the most publick place near to that where the Murder was committed, the same to be on Friday the 16 instant.

Also by Order from the Gov<sup>r</sup> Separate Dead Warrants issued for the Execution of Thomas Garnett and Charles Smith condemned at the Special Court held for Talbot County on the 15 day of January last, the Execution to be on Monday the Nineteenth of May instant.

Also by Order from the Governor, Dead Warrant issued for the Execution of Richard Downman condemned at Talbot County犯者 in Sept<sup>r</sup> last the Execution to be on Monday the Nineteenth day of May instant.

May 13. By Order from the Governor their "com" and posse comit: was renewed to Thomas Gherardi to be sheriff of Baltimore County. Dated 27 May 1729

May 17. By Order from the Governor their "com" posse comit: and writ of discharge to John Baker late Sheriff issued to George Clarke Gent to be sheriff of Saint Marys County, All dated 4 June 1729.

May 30. By Order from the Governor Dead Warrant issued for the Execution of Negro Babb condemned at last Kent County犯者 for felony the Execution to be on the Seventeenth day of June next.

June 4. By Order from the Governor Reprieve issued for Negro Stephen Short in Calvert County Goal under Sentence of Death.

June 8. Same By order from the Governor their "com" posse comit: and writ of discharge to John Gresham late Sheriff issued to Joseph Young Gent to be sheriff of Kent County, All dated 8 June 1729.

June 11. By Order from the Governor their "com" posse comit: and writ of discharge to John Howard late Sheriff issued to Randolph Morris to be sheriff Charles County with a Decimus postulation directed to John Brisco, Charles Somerset Smith, Henry Holt and Hawkins, or any two of them to swear him, All dated 3 July 1729.
