 Whereas Charles Steward late of Annapolis Apothecary otherwise called Charles
 Steward late of Annapolis in the County of Ann Arundel Surgeon is
 detained in Our Goal of Ann Arundel County under Sentence of Death for
 certain Burglary and Felony by him committed whereof he was convicted
 the tenth day of April One thousand seven hundred thirty and four before
 the Honourable John Smith and George Dent Esq. Justices of Oyer and
 Terminer and Goal Delivery for the County of as appears by the Record
 thereof transmitted to Our Provincial Court at W^h whereon for diverse
 Causes and Considerations Us hereunto moving We have thought fit
 to supersede the Execution of the said Sentence We therefore command
 You that from the Execution of that Sentence or any other Sentence of
 Death pronounced against the said Charles Steward You altogether
 surcease and forbear until Our further Pleasure shall be known therein
 Provided that the said Charles Steward continue not within
 the City of Annapolis the Space of One Hour from the Time of his
 Delivery from Our said Goal and provided also that the said Charles
 Steward transport himself or cause himself to be transported out of
 this Our Province within Five Days from the Date hereof, otherwise
 this Our Reprieve shall be and is hereby declared to be void and of no
 Effect anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding
 Witness Our trusty and Well beloved Samuel Ogle Esq. Governor
 of Our said Province this fourth Day of May in the Twentieth
 Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1734
