In Pursuance of an Act of Parliament made & passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of King William the third Intituled An Act for preventing Frauds & regulating Abuses in the Plantation Trade

I Jurat Patrick Greagh of Maryland Merchant that the Schooner Annapolis of Maryland whereof Richard Martyn is at present Master being a square rived Vessel of the Burthen of about fifty Tons and formerly called the Adventure Sloop was built at Newbury in the Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England in the Year 1733 and called the Patuxent as appears by a former Register now cancelled and was by Decrees of the Court of Vice Admiralty of this Province the 31. day of July 1734 condemned and forfeited to the Use of his Majesty, his Excellency Samuel Ogle Esq. Governor of the said Province and John Cosby Esq. Collector of his Majesty's Customs in the District of Patuxent for breach of the Acts of Trade & Navigation and that Charles Ferris of Surgeon & he this Deponent are at present Owners thereof & that no Foreigner directly nor indirectly hath any Share or Part or Interest therein
