Fredrick absolute Lord and Proprietary of the
Province of Maryland and also Lord Baltimore & Wallen
Bailiffs and good People wherein these Presents shall come greeting.
Whereas James Lee Junr. of Baltimore County Planter stands indicted
for Manslaughter committed upon the Body of one Negroe Slave called
Nafe Hines ye that we of Our special Grace certain Knowledge and more
Mition and at the humble Petition of the said James Lee have pardoned
reliefed and discharged and by these presents for us our Heirs and suc-
cessors do pardon release and discharge to the said James Lee of Baltimore
County Planter or by any other Name or Addition that Master or Slave
the said James Lee was lately or is now known distinguished and called
the Toller or Homicide of the said Negroe Nafe and every the just paye
and other Misdeeds in any manner touching or concerning the Death
of the said Negroe Nafe and all and every kind of Suit Complaint Action
Impeachment and demand whatsoever which we against the said James
Lee by Reason or Preision of the Remises have or may hereafter have and
the Prosecution of the same which lies against the said James Lee belongs
or hereafter may belong And therefore we give and grant unto him our
said Slave by these presents so that he may stand right in all Courts if
anyone against him shall object the Premises or any of them. Witness
Our trusty and well beloved Brother George Eng. Governor and Commander
in Chief under our said Province this 12th day of September
Anno Domini 1764.
