Unto You the said Charles Goldsborough as you shall see convenient and to take and Receive for your proper use and behoof all due and just Fees, Profits and Emoluments belonging to a Judge of such a Court, Which have been by us Established in which shall hereafter be by us or our Governour and Council by our Authority hereafter Established, And generally to Act, do Perform and Execute all and singular the Powers and Jurisdictions to You hereby granted untill such time as We shall signify our Will and Pleasure to the contrary. Witness our Trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq. Governour and Commander in Chief in and over our said Province at the City of Annapolis this Seventh day of December in the Fourteenth Year of his Saidships Dominion Annoq. Domini 1764.
