

167 Exercise Execute and Enjoy the said Office of Judge and Commissary General and Commissioner in Chief for Probate of Wills and granting Administrations within the said Province as aforesaid unto you the said Charles Goldsbrough as you shall see Convenient and to take and Receive for your proper use and Behoof all due and just Fees, Profits and Imoluments belonging to a Judge of such a Court, Which have been by us Established or which shall hereafter be by us or our Governor and Council by our Authority hereafter established, And generally to Act do Perform and Execute all and Singular the Powers and Jurisdictions to you hereby granted until such time as we shall signify our Will and Pleasure to the contrary. Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq: Governor and Commander in Chief in and over our said Province at the City of Annapolis this Seventh day of December in the Fourteenth Year of his Lordships Reign annoq: Domini 1761.
