of Great Choptank Parish in Worcester County.

Induction granted in Common form to the Rev. Mr. David Love to be Rector of All  
Hallows Parish in Annapolis County.

7th November 1765.

Commission issued in Common form to Allen Dugan of Annapolis County to  
be one of the Coronors of the said County.

Good People to whom these presents shall come. Know ye that of our special Grace  
We have pardoned unto Negroe Sue late of Charles County Labourer the Slave of a certain  
Constant Chapman of the same County as a proper Object of our Mercy, the Suit of our  
Peace, and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that the said Negroe Sue on the Tenth  
day of January in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Sixty Six  
at Charles County aforesaid, feloniously, wilfully and of her Malice aforethought  
was present, aiding, helping, abetting, comforting, assisting and maintaining  
said ~~in~~ Negroe Jack of Charles County aforesaid Slave of the aforesaid  
Chapman.
