Chapman on Murdering a certain William Garner against the Peace of the said Lord Proprietary his good Rule and Government whereof she was convicted before Our Trusty and well beloved Thomas Stone Esq. and others Justices of Charles County on Tuesday the eleventh day of March One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Six, Nevertheless We grant unto her Our firm Peace and Will not that she suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore, but that she shall stand and be in the same Flight and Condition to all Intents and purposes as if the said Felony whereof she the said Negro Sue hath been convicted had never been done or committed. Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Our said Province this Twentieth day of March in the Fifteenth Year of His Lordships Dominion Anno. Fredrick, Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To all Our Bailiffs and Good People to whom these presents shall come: Know Ye that of Our especial Grace We have Pardoned unto Negro Robin late of Worcester County Labourer the Slave of a certain Thomas Hayward Junr. of Somerset County, as a proper Object of Our Mercy, the Suit of Our Peace, and Whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that the said Negro Robin on the Tenth day of January in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Six at Worcester County by aforesaid, feloniously, Wilfully and of his Malice aforethought was present aiding, helping, abetting, comforting, assisting and Maintaining a certain Negro David late of Worcester County Esq. Deceased, the Slave of a certain Joseph Scott of Dorchester County in Murdering a certain Henry Selby against the Peace of the said Lord Proprietary his good Rule and Government whereof he was ^{Our Trusty and well beloved} convicted before William Allen Esq. and others Justices of Worcester County on the fourth day of March in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Six, Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and Will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore, but that he shall stand and be in the same Flight and Condition to all Intents and purposes as if the said Felony whereof the said Negro Robin hath been convicted had never been done or committed. Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the said Province this 12th day of April in the Fifteenth Year of Our Dominion Anno. Domini 1766.
