the Goods and Chattels of the said Benjamin Harnwood then and thervin the said
Meat House being then and there feloniously took Stole and Carried away against
Our Peace Good Rule and Government and Contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly
in such case made and Provided whereof he was Convict before Our Jury and
well beloved John Cooke Esq. and others Justices of Prince Georges County Nevertheless
We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any corporal Pu-
nishment therefore but that he shall stand and be in the same Right and Condition
full intent and purpos as if the said Felony whereof he the said Negro Charles
had bin (or not had never been done or committed) Wishes Our Jury and well
beloved Henric Sharp Esq. Governor of Our said Province this Thirtieth day of
September in the fifteenth year of His Lordships Dominion Anno Domini 1765.

Frederick Calvert Lord and Proprietor of the Province of
Maryland and Eleaten Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. &c. all Our Bailiffs and
good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting. Whereas Richard
Smith late of St. Ann Arundel County Labourer is detained in Our Gaol of Anne Arun-
del County under Sentence of Death for a certain Felony by him committed whereof
he was Convict the twenty fourth of October in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand
Seven hundred and Sixty five before John Price Esq. and others Justi-
ces of our Provincial Court and itt reas for diverse causes and considerations as
hereunto making we have thought fit to supersede the Execution of the said Sentence
We therefore command you that from the Execution of that Sentence or any other Sen-
tence of Death pronounced against the said Richard Smith with You allecteth Our cause
and forbear until our further pleasure shall be knowne therein Provided that the
said Richard Smith continue not within the City of Annapolis the Place of
One steare from the time of his delivery from Our said Gaol and Provided also
that the said Richard Smith transport himself or cause himself to be transported out
