Frederick absolute Lord and Proprietary of the  
Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore To all the  
Knights and good People to whom these Presents shall come greeting.  
Whereas James Sec Jun<sup>r</sup> of Baltimore County Planter stands indicted  
for Manslaughter committed upon the body of one Negroe Slave called  
Nafe Kinore ye that We of our special Grace reason Knowledge and con-  
solation and at the humble Petition of the said James Sec have pardoned  
released and discharged and by these presents for us our Heirs and suc-  
cessors do pardon release and discharge to the said James Sec of Baltimore  
County Planter or by any other Name or Addition that Mistake or Place  
the said James Sec was lately or is now known distinguished and called  
the Slaughterer Homicide of the said Negroe Nafe and every the susseps  
and other Misdeds in any manner touching or concerning the Death  
of the said Negroe Nafe and all and every kind of Suit Complaint Action  
Impeachment and demand whatsoever which are against the said James  
Sec by Reason or occasion of the Premises have or may hereafter have and  
the Prosecution of the Peace which now against the said James Sec belong  
or hereafter may belong And therefore we give and grant unto him our  
firm Peace by these presents so that he may stand right in all Courts if  
any are against him shall object the Premises or any of them. Witness  
our trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq<sup>r</sup> Governour and Commander  
in Chief in and over our said Province this 12th day of September  
Anne Twentieth 1764.
