missioner in Chief for Trial of Wills and granting Administrations within the  
said Province as aforesaid. Unto You the said Charles Goldsborough as you shall see  
Convenient and to take and Receive for your proper use and behoof all due and  
just Fees, Profits and Emoluments belonging to a Judge of such a Court, which  
have been by us Established or which shall hereafter be by us or our Governor and  
Council by our Authority hereafter Established, And generally to Act, do Perform  
and Execute all and singular the Powers and Jurisdictions to you hereby granted  
untill such time as We shall signify our Will and Pleasure to the contrary.  
Witness our Trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq. Governor and Com-  
mander in Chief in and over our said Province at the City of Annapolis this  
Seventh day of December in the Fourteenth Year of his said Ships Dominion  
Annoq. Domini 1761.

15th December 1761. Then came the Honble Charles Goldsborough Esq. before us the  
Subscribers Two of his said Ships Justices of the Provincial Court and qualified  
himself as Commissary General of the Province of Maryland by taking the several  
Oaths to the Government required by Law, repeating the Test and Subscribing the  
same and Oath of Abjuration and also took the usual Oath of Office prescribed by  
the Inspection Law.
