Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore. To all our Bailiffs and Good People to whom these presents shall come Know ye that of our especial Grace we have Pardon'd unto Negroe Sue late of Charles County Labourer the Slave of a certain Constant Chapman of the same County as a proper Object of our Mercy, the Suit of our Peace, and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that the said Negroe Sue on the Twentieth day of January in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Six at Charles County aforesaid, feloniously, wilfully and of her Malice aforethought was present, aiding, helping, abetting, comforting, assisting and maintaining the said Negroe Sue late of Charles County aforesaid Slave of the aforesaid Chapman
