is for the body of Prince Georges County do upon their Oath present that Negro Charles late of

in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty five at Prince Georges County &c with  
force and Arms and to wit the Meat House of a certain Benjamin Harwood, the said Me-  
at House being then and there well boarded and the Door thereof secured with a Lock felon-  
ously did break and enter and Ten Hams of Bacon, Meat and ten Fitches of Bacon Meat of the  
value of Ten Shillings Sterling Money of the Goods and Chattels of the said Benjamin Harwood  
then and there in the said Meat House being then and there feloniously took, stole and
