And now here at this day to wit the second Tuesday in March aft. the said Negro Jack, Negro Sue and Negro Hannah in Custody of the Sheriff namely Charles Somerset Smith Gentleman to the Bars here brought in their proper Person, and being demanded of them by the Court here how of the Felony afo. above on them implead themselves they would acquit they the said Negro Jack, Negro Sue and Negro Hannah say that they are not Guilty in manner and form as by the Indictment afo. against them it is supposed, and for Trial thereof for Good and for they put themselves upon the Country and John Rogers Gent. who for the Lord Proprietary in this part followeth also, It is therefore Commanded the Sheriff that he cause to Come here Immediately Twelve Men who neither be to recognize be because as well as and the Jurors afo. by the Sheriff afo. thereto Impannelled being called to say John Hanlon, John Charles Lowe, Michael Dent, William Lindsey, Henry Brett, Richard Rately, John Chapman, Thomas Hawkins, Barton Smoot, William Cox, James Maddox, Justinian Cooksey Jun. who to speak the Truth in the Premises being duly elected Tried and Sworn upon their Oaths say that the said Negro Jack, and Negro Sue are Guilty of the Felony and Murder afo. in manner and form as by the Indictment afo. against them it is supposed, the Jurors afo. upon their Oaths afo. do say that Negro Hannah is not Guilty of the matter whereof she stands Indicted - Whereupon the said Negro Jack and Negro Sue being asked whether they had any thing for themselves to say why the Court here to Judgment of and upon the Verdict afo. of the Jurors afo. ought not to Proceed said nothing Material. Whereupon all and Singular the Premises being by the Court here seen heard and fully understood It is therefore Considered by the Court here that the said Negro Jack and Negro Sue be Carried to the Goal from whence they came, and from thence to be Led to the Place of Execution and there to be hanged up by the Neck until they be Dead -
