Maryland's Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore To all Our Subjects and Good People to whom these Presents shall come greeting Know ye that of Our Special grace we have Pardoned unto Thomas Robinson late of Baltimore County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever Appertaineth unto Us for that the said Thomas Robinson on the Tenth day of May in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Sixty eight between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with force and arms at the County of the Mansion House of a certain Alexander McMechan there situate feloniously and burglariously did break and enter and One piece of silver called a Spanish Dollar of the value of four Shillings and Sixpence Sterling Money of the Goods and Chattels of the said Alexander McMechan in the same Mansion House then and there being feloniously and burglariously did steal take and carry away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government, whereas he was convicted at Our Court of Assize held in and for Baltimore County on Tuesday the Sixth Day of September in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Sixty eight before Our Trusty and well beloved John Hepburn and Daniel of Saint Thomas Jenifer Esq. Justices of Assize & Justices Oyer and Terminer and Goal Delivery of Our Western Circuit Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore Provided that he the said Thomas Robinson shall within Ten Days from the Time of his Delivery out of Goal Transport himself or cause himself to be transported out of this Our Province never to return again otherwise this Our Pardon shall be and is hereby declared Void and of no Effect anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Horatio Sharpe Esq. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Our said Province this 11<sup>th</sup> Day of October in the eighteenth Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1760 -

Maryland's Horatio Sharpe Esq. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Province of Maryland To Samuel Chamberlaine Junior of Talbot County Esq. Greeting Having Special Trust and Confidence in your Fidelity Integrity Knowledge and Circumspection I do hereby Nominate constitute and Appoint you the said Samuel Chamberlaine Junior to be Naval Officer of Oxford within the Province aforesaid Hereby giving and granting unto you the said Samuel Chamberlaine Junior full Power and Authority to Act do perform and execute all and singular the Lawful Powers and Authorities and other Things whatsoever incident to the said Office of Naval Officer and to take and receive to your own proper use and benefit all such Lawful Fees Perquisites and Advantages as to the said Office do in any wise appertain To have and to hold the same during Pleasure -
