Ben late of Talbot County Labourer the Slave of a certain Rachel Garrison of said County as a
proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that
the said Negro Ben heretofore to wit on the Twentieth day of November in the Year of Our Lord
seventeen hundred and Sixty eight with Force and Arms at Talbot County aforesaid of his Ma-
lice Propense and forethought wickedly wilfully and feloniously made upon a certain Eve
Shanahan of the County aforesaid Widow an Assault did make and her the said Eve Shanahan
then and there being a White Woman within this Province viz. at Talbot County aforesaid did then
and there wickedly wilfully and feloniously consult Advise Conspire and Attempt to Ravish
and lawfully know against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of
the Act of Assembly in such case made and Provides whereof he was Convict before the Worship-
ful Risdon Bowman Esq. and others Justices of Talbot County aforesaid on the first Tuesday
in March, seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine Nevertheless we grant unto him Our farr
Peace and will not that he suffer any corporal Punishment therefore but that he shall stand
and be in the same slight and condition to all intents and Purposes as if the said Felony where-
of he the said Negro Ben hath been Convict had never been done or committed —

the Year of our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine with Force and Arms at the County aforesaid
did the Meat House of a certain Jacob Davis there situate the said Meat House being an Out-House
and the Door thereof Secured with a Lock and the said Meat House being well Boarded did break
and Enter and three hundred Pounds of Salt of the Value of thirty Shillings Sterling of the Goods and
Chattels of the said Jacob Davis in the said Meat House then being then and there feloniously did Steal
