Letter of Pardon granted in Common form to the Reverend M<sup>r</sup> John Scott to Preach in the Parish in Charles County called Durham Parish Vacant by the Death of the Reverend M<sup>r</sup> William Bowie - - -

Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon ~~Lord~~ Baron of Baltimore, To all Our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come greeting Know Ye that of Our especial grace we have Pardoned unto Thomas Dickes late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peers and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that the said Thomas Dickes on the first day of December in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Eight with Force and Arms did go forth at Ann Arundel County at the Meat House of a certain Beriah Mayberry being an Out House and the said Meat House being then and there well boarded and the Door thereof secured with a Lock feloniously did break and enter and One hundred Pounds of Bacon of the value of thirty Shillings Sterling Money of the Goods and Chattels of the said Beriah Mayberry then and there in the said House being found then and there feloniously stole took and carried away - And also for that the said Thomas Dickes on the first day of January in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine at Ann Arundel County at with Force and Arms so forth the Warehouse of a certain Charles Carroll's adjoined not being contiguous to or used with any Mansion House did feloniously break and enter and two Gallons of Rum of the value of Five Shillings Sterling the Goods and Chattels of a certain Thomas Charles Williams then and there in the said Warehouse being found then and there out of the said Warehouse feloniously stole took and carried away And also for that the said Thomas Dickes on the said first Day of January in the Year of between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms at Ann Arundel County at the Dwelling House of a certain Samuel Chase there situated feloniously and burglariously did break and enter and three Gallons of Wine to the value of Five Shillings Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said Samuel Chase in the said Dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously and burglariously did steal take and carry away - And also for that the said Thomas Dickes on the Sixth Day of April in the Year aforesaid at Ann Arundel County at between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms the Dwelling House of Richard Maccubbin there situated feloniously and Burglariously did break and enter and One Silk Gown of the value of Twelve Shillings Sterling One pair of Ear Rings of the Value of Five Shillings Sterling two Handkerchiefs of the Value of Two Shillings Sterling One Gold Ring of the value of five Shillings Sterling One Necklace of the Value of One Shilling Sterling and Two Spoons of the value of One Shilling Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said Richard Maccubbin in the said Dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously
