Letter of License granted in common form to the Reverend Mr John Scott to Preach in the Parish in Charles County called Durham Parish Vacant by the Death of the Reverend Mr William Davies - - -

Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore, &c To all Our Barliffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come greeting. Know ye that of Our especial grace we have Pardoned unto Thomas Dicks late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that the said Thomas Dicks on the first day of December in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty eight with Force and Arms did go forth at Ann Arundel County aforesaid the Meat House of a certain Beriah Mayberry being an Out House and the said Meat House being then and there well boarded and the Door thereof secured with a Lock feloniously did break and enter and One hundred Pounds of Bacon of the value of thirty Shillings Sterling Money of the Goods and Chattels of the said Beriah Mayberry then and there in the said House being found then and there feloniously stole took and carried away - And also for that the said Thomas Dicks on the first day of January in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine at Ann Arundel County aforesaid with Force and Arms & so forth the Warehouse of a certain Charles Carroll Barberster not being contiguous to or upon with any Mansion House did feloniously break and enter and two Gallons of Rum of the value of Five Shillings Sterling the Goods and Chattels of a certain Thomas Charles Williams then and there in the said Warehouse being found then and there out of the said Warehouse feloniously stole took and carried away And also for that the said Thomas Dicks on the said first Day of January in the Year aforesaid between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms at Ann Arundel County aforesaid the Dwelling House of a certain Samuel Chase there situated feloniously and burglariously did break and enter and three Gallons of Wine to the value of Five Shillings Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said Samuel Chase in the said Dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously and burglariously did steal take and carry away - And also for that the said Thomas Dicks on the Sixth Day of April in the Year aforesaid at Ann Arundel County aforesaid between the Hours of Nine & Twelve in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms the Dwelling House of Richard Macubbins there situated feloniously and Burglariously did Break and Enter and One Silk Gowne of the value of Twelve Shillings Sterling One pair of Ear Rings of the Value of Five Shillings Sterling two Handkerchiefs of the Value of Two Shillings Sterling One Gold Ring of the value of Five Shillings Sterling One Tie lace of the Value of One Shilling Sterling and Two Spoons of the value of One Shilling Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said Richard Macubbins in the said Dwelling House others and there being then and there feloniously and
