

and burglariously did steal take and carry away And likewise for that the said Thomas Diche on the first day of May in the year aforesaid with Forces and Arms and so forth at Ann Arundel County aforesaid the Smoke House of a certain George Stewart Esq. being an Out House and the said Smoke House being then and there well boarded, the Door thereof secured with a Lock feloniously did break and enter and One hundred Pounds of Bacon of the Value of thirty Shillings Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said George Stewart then and there in the said Smoke House being found there feloniously stole took & carried away against Our Peace Goods Rules and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such Cases made and Provided; whereof he was convicted at Our Court of Assize held and for Ann Arundel County aforesaid on Monday the Eleventh Day of September in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine before Our Trusty and well beloved John Hepburn and George Stewart Esq. Justices of Assize Vice Prius Oyer and Terminet and Goal Delivery of Our Western Circuit Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any corporal Punishment therefore Provided that he the said Thomas Diche continue not within the City of Annapolis the Space of Twelve Hours from the time of his Delivery out of Goal and Provide also that he the said Thomas Diche Transport himself or cause himself to be Transported out of this Our Province within ten Days from the Date hereof otherwise this Our Pardon shall be and is hereby declared to be Void and of none Effect anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Robert Eden Esq. Governour and Commander in Chief in and over Our said Province this 16. Day of September in the Nineteenth Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1709 -
