

Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore. To all our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting. Know Ye that of Our Especial Grace We have Pardoned unto Negro George the Slave of a certain Thomas Wright of Ann Arundel County as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that the said Negro George on the first day of November in the Year of Our Lord seventeen hundred and sixty nine between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms at Ann Arundel County at the Dwelling House of a certain Catharine H. Knowsley there situate Feloniously and Burglariously did break and enter and one Womens Gown of the value of five Shillings Sterling, Two Pettycoats of the value of One Shilling Sterling each, Two Pair of Thread Stockings of the value of One Shilling Sterling each Pair, One Frying Pan of the value of One Shilling Sterling and one Iron Poth of the value of Two Shillings Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said Catharine Knowsley in the said Dwelling House then and there being, then and there Feloniously and Burglariously did steal Take and carry away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made, and provided when he was convicted before the Worshipful Robert Rouden and others Justices of Ann Arundel County on Tuesday the fourteenth day of November Seventeen hundred and sixty nine. Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefore but that he shall stand and be in the same Plight and Condition to all intents and Purposes as if the said Felony whereof he the said Negro George hath been convicted had never been done or committed.
