Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore To all Our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting Know Ye that of Our especial Grace We have Pardoned unto Negro James late of Calvert County Labourer the Slave of a certain Benjamin Sedwicks of the said County as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that the said Negro James on the first day of January in the Year Seventeen hundred and Seventy at Calvert County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the same Court with Force and Arms and so forth One Strawberry, Swan Gelding of the Price of Five Pounds Current Money of the Goods and Chattels of a certain Francis Cobrith then and there being found then and there feloniously stole took and carried away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such Case made and Provided whereof he was Convict on Tuesday the Nineteenth day of June in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Seventy before the Worshipful Young Parran Esq. and others Justices of Calvert County aforesaid Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same Right and Condition to all Intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof the said Negro James hath been Convict had never been done or Committed - Witnesses Our Brother Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant Governor and Chief Commander in and over Our said Province this 23 day of July in the Twentieth Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1770 -

Maryland 1770 Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore To all Our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting - Know Ye that of Our especial Grace we have Pardoned unto Negro David late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that the said Negro David on the first day of September in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine with Force and Arms and so forth at Ann Arundel County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the same Court the Milk House of a certain Joseph Galloway the said Milk House being an Outhouse and being then and there well boarded and the Door thereof secured with a Lock feloniously did Break and enter and Two Butter Potts of the value of One penny Sterling each Pott, Two Pewter Basons of the value of Sixpence Sterling each Bason Six Shirts of the value of Three Shillings Sterling each Shirt Two Pair of Breeches of the value of five Shillings Sterling each, Three jackets of the value of Two Shillings Sterling each jacket, Three Handkerchiefs of the value of Sixpence Sterling each Handkerchief and one Petticoat of the value of One Shilling Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said Joseph Galloway then and there in the said Milk House being found then and there feloniously stole took and carried away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such Case made and Provided whereof he
