Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor Provided that he the said Negro David Transport himself or cause himself to be Transported out of this Our Province within Twenty four Hours from the Time of his Delivery out of Gaol and never to return again otherwise this Our Pardon shall be and is hereby declared to be void and of no Effect anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding. - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over Our said Province this 10th day of August in the 20th Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1770. -

Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore. To all Our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting Know ye that of Our Special Grace we have Pardoned unto Negro Nacey late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever Appertaineth unto Us for that he the said Negro Nacey on the first day of September in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty Nine with Force and Arms and so forth at Ann Arundel County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the same Court the Spring House of a certain Joseph Galloway the said Spring House being an Outhouse and being then and there well boarded and the Door thereof secured with a lock feloniously did Break and Enter and In Butter Poths of the value of one penny Sterling each Poth Two Pewter Basons of the value of Sixpence Sterling each Bason six Shirts of the value of three Shillings Sterling each Two pair of Breeches of the value of five Shillings Sterling each Pair Three jackets of the value of Two Shillings Sterling each jacket, Three Handkerchiefs of the value of Sixpence Sterling each Handkerchief and one Pettycoat of the value of One Shilling Sterling the Goods and Chattels of the said Joseph Galloway then and there in the said Milk House being found then and there feloniously stole took and carried away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and Provided whereof he was convicted before the Worshipful Reverend Gheselin Gentleman and others Justices of Ann Arundel County aforesaid on Tuesday the Fourteenth day of August in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Seventy. Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same Plight and condition to all intents and Purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof he the said Negro Nacey hath been convicted had never been done or committed - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over Our said Province this 10th Day of August in the 20th Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1770 -
