 unto William Made late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy
 the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever Appertaineth unto Us for that he the said William
 Made on the fourth day of February in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred
 and seventy between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with
 Force and Arms at the County aforesaid the Dwelling House of a certain Brice Warfield
 there situate feloniously and burglariously did break and enter and one Blue cloth
 coat of the value of five Shillings Sterling one pair of breeches of the value of five Shillings
 Sterling one red cloth Waistcoat of the value of five Shillings Sterling Three Shirts of
 the value of five Shillings Sterling each Shirt one pair of Drawers of the value of one
 Shilling Sterling one pair of Stockings of the value of sixpence Sterling one pair of Sheets
 of the value of five Shillings Sterling one Violin of the value of Ten Shillings Sterling one
 pair of Silver Knee Buckles of the value of five Shillings Sterling one paper of Pins of the
 value of sixpence Sterling one pair of Saddle Straps of the value of one penny Sterling and
 one ounce of Black Pepper of the value of one penny Sterling of the Goods and Chattels of the said
 Brice Warfield in the same Dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously
 and burglariously did steal take and carry away against Our Peace good Rule and Go-
 vernment wherof he was convicted before Our Trusty and well beloved William Hayward Esq^r
 and others Justices of Our Provincial Court on Tuesday the Eleventh day of September in the Year
 of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy Nevertheless we grant unto him Our
