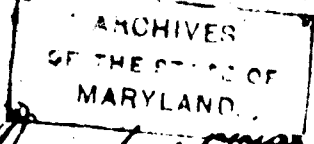

Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c To all Our Bailiffs and Good People to whom these presents shall come Greeting Know Ye that of Our Especial Grace we have pardoned unto John Hammarsh late of Baltimore County Labourer as a proper Object of Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that he the said John Hammarsh on the Tenth day of August in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy with force and Arms at Baltimore County aforesaid One gelding of a grey colour then and there found then and there feloniously did steal take and lead away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of An Act of Assembly in such Case made and provided whereof he was convicted before Our Trusty and well beloved William Hayward Esquire and others Justices of Our Provincial Court on Tuesday the Eleventh day of September in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand hundred and Seventy Nevertheless We grant unto him Our full pardon and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor Provided that he the said John Hammarsh shall pay and satisfy to the Sheriff of Baltimore County all the Officers Fees arising due on his Imprisonment Tryal and Conviction and likewise the several Fees arising
