Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esquire Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over Our said Province this 17th day of January in the Twentieth Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1771.

Know Ye that of Our Especial Grace we have Pardoned unto John Dealby late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that he the said John Dealby on the third day of November in the Year of Our Lord One Thous and Seven hundred and Seventy between the Hours of Nine and four in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms at Ann Arundel County aforesaid the Dwelling House of a certain Valentine Brown there situate feloniously and burglariously did Break and Enter and five Yards of Broad Cloth of the value of fifteen Shillings Sterling each Yard Twenty five Yards of Irish Linnen of the value of Two Shillings Sterling each Yard One Shirt of the value of five Shillings Sterling, Two Paper Bills of Credit called Eight Dollar Bills of Credit made to entitle the Bearer thereof to receive Bills of Exchange payable in London or Gold and Silver at the rate of four Shillings and Sixpence Sterling per Dollar for the said Bills according to an Act of Assembly of the Province of Maryland of the value of thirty Shillings Sterling each Bill, Four Bills of Credit called four Dollar Bills of Credit made to entitle the Bearer thereof to receive Bills of Exchange payable in London or Gold and Silver at the rate of four Shillings and Sixpence Sterling per Dollar for the said Bills according to an Act of Assembly of the said Province of the value of eighteen Shillings Sterling each Bill, Two Bills of Credit called Six Dollar Bills of Credit made to entitle the Bearer thereof to receive Bills of Exchange payable in London or Gold and Silver at the rate of four Shillings and Sixpence Sterling per Dollar for the said Bills according to the Direction of an Act of Assembly of the said Province of the value of Twenty seven Shillings Sterling each Bill, Two Bills of Credit called Two Dollar Bills of Credit made to entitle the Bearer thereof to receive Bills of Exchange payable in London or Gold and Silver at the rate of four Shillings and Sixpence Sterling per Dollar for the said Bills according to an Act of Assembly of the said Province of the value of Nine Shillings Sterling each Bill, Four Pieces of Silver called Spanish Dollars of the value of four Shillings and Sixpence Sterling each Piece Two Pieces of Gold called Half Johanneses of the value of Thirty six Shillings Sterling each Piece Twenty One Pieces of Gold called English Guineas of the value of Twenty one Shillings Sterling each Piece of the Goods and Chattels of the said Valentine Brown in the said Dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously and burglariously did Steal take and carry away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government whereof he was convicted before Our Trusty and well beloved Daniel of Saint Thomas Jenifer Esq. and others Justices of an Especial Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal Delivery held in and for Ann Arundel County at
