

Stick of the value of one Shilling Current Money of Maryland which the said Negro Charles in both his hands then and there had and held did feloniously wilfully and of his Malice aforethought strike and wound the said Negro George and did then and there feloniously wilfully and of his Malice aforethought give to the said Negro George one Mortal Wound with the Hickory Stick aforesaid in and upon the Forehead of him the said Negro George of the Length of one Inch and an half and of the Breadth of two Inches of which said Mortal Wound the said Negro George from the said first day of November in the Year aforesaid until the fourth day of November aforesaid in the same Year at the Parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid did languish and languishing did live, on which said fourth day of November in the Year aforesaid the said Negro George at the Parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid of the said Mortal Wound died and that the said Negro Charles the said Negro George in manner and form aforesaid feloniously wilfully and of his Malice aforethought did Kill and Murder against Our Peace Good Rule and Government whereof he was convicted before the Worshipful Judge William Allen and others Justices of Worcester County aforesaid on the fifth day of March in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy One - Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor - Provided that he the said Negro Charles do not sport himself or cause himself to be transported out of this Our Province to one of the Islands in the West Indies within Two Months from the date hereof, and never to return again otherwise this Our Pardon shall be and is hereby declared to be void and of no Effect anything herein contained to contrary in anywise Notwithstanding - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant General & Chief Governor in and over Our said Province this 12th day of April in the Twentieth Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1771 -

Frederick's Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore and so forth - To all Our Bailiffs and Good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting - Know Ye that of Our Special Grace we have pardoned unto John Hussey late of Prince Georges County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that he the said John Hussey on the third day of March in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy one between the Hours of Nine and Twelve in the Night of the same Day with Force & Arms at Prince Georges County aforesaid the Dwelling House of a certain Elizabeth Hawkins there situate feloniously and burglariously did break and enter and two Drunks of the value of Five Shillings Sterling each one Lapuchin of the value of Ten Shillings Sterling one Cloak of the value of Ten Shillings Sterling five Womens Laps of the value of One Shilling Sterling each, three Womens Shifts of the value of five Shillings Sterling each, three Handkerchiefs of the value of three Shillings Sterling each Two Sheets of the value of Five Shillings
