will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor Provided that he the said
John Stukely shall within Ten Days from the Time of his Delivery out of Goal Trans-
port himself or cause himself to be Transported out of this Our Province and never to
return again otherwise this Our Pardon shall be and is hereby declared to be Void and
of no Effect any thing herein contained to the contrary Notwithstanding - Witness Our
Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esquire Lieutenant General and Chief
Governor in and over Our said Province this 12th day of April in the Twentieth Year
of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1771 -

and enter and Two Trunks of the value of Five Shillings Sterling each One Lapuchin of the
value of Ten Shillings Sterling, One Coat of the value of ten Shillings Sterling Five
Womens Laps of the value of One Shilling Sterling each three Womens Shifts of the value of
five Shillings Sterling each three Handkerchiefs of the value of three Shillings Sterling each Two
Sheets of the value of five Shillings Sterling each Two Table Cloths of the value of Three
Shillings Sterling each and Two Ounces of Thread of the value of six pence Sterling each of
the Goods and Chattels of the said Elizabeth Hawkins in the said Dwelling House then
and there being then and there feloniously and burglariously did steal take and carry
away against Our Peace Good Rule and Government and contrary to the forms of the Act of
Assembly in such case made and provided whereof he was convicted before Our Trusty and
well beloved John Hepburn Esquire and others Justices of an Especial Court of Oyer and
Terminer and Goal Delivery held in and for Prince Georges County on Friday the Twenti-
ninth day of March in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy
One Nevertheless We grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer
any Corporal Punishment therefor Provided that he the said John Dunning
