Maryland<sup>ss</sup> Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore and so forth - To all Our Bailiffs and Good People to whom these presents shall come greeting - Know ye that of Our special grace we have pardoned unto George Duffey late of All-hallows Parish in Worcester County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever Appertaineth unto Us for that he the said George Duffey on the Twelfth day of January in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy One with Force and Arms at the Parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid the Shop of a certain William Merrills feloniously did break and enter and one Silver Watch of the value of six pounds Current Money of Maryland and one other Silver Watch of the value of Fifty Shillings Current Money of Maryland One pair of Silver Shoe Buckles of the value of Twenty five Shillings Current Money of Maryland One pair of Silver Shoe Buckles of the value of Ten Shillings Current Money of Maryland and two pair of Silver Shew Buttons of the value of Two Shillings Current Money each pair the Goods and Chattels of the said William Merrills in the same Shop then and there being found then and there did feloniously steal take and carry away against Our Peace good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such Cases made and provided whereof he was convicted before William Allen Esq<sup>r</sup> and others Justices of an Especial Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal Delivery held in and for Worcester County on Saturday the Sixth day of April in the Year of Our Lord seven hundred and Seventy One Nevertheless we grant unto him Our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any corporal Punishment therefor Provided that he the said George Duffey Transport himself or cause himself to be Transported out of this Our Province within Ten Days from the Time of his delivery out of Goals and never to return again otherwise this Our
