Maryland J^r. Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To all Our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come greeting. - Know ye that of Our especial Grace we have Pardoned unto Negro Anthony late of Ann Arundel County Labourer as a proper Object of Our Mercy the Suit of Our Peace and whatsoever appertained unto Us for that he the said Negro Anthony on the Tenth day of March in the Year of Our Lord Seventeen hundred and Seventy One at Ann Arundel County aforesaid with Force and Arms and so forth the Store House of a certain Patrick Macgill (not being contiguous to or used with any Mansion House) did feloniously break and enter and four Yards and one half Yard of Red Shag of the value of Twelve Shillings each Yard Twenty five Yards and three Quarters of a Yard of Irish Poplin of the value of Two Shillings each Yard, five Yards of Blue Callimanco of the value of One Shilling and sixpence each Yard One Butter Pot of the value of one Shilling one Stone Jug of the value of one Shilling and fifteen hundred Pins of the value of four Shillings the goods and Chattels of the said Patrick Macgill then and there in the said Store House being found there and there out of the said Store House feloniously stole took and carried away against Our Peace good Rule and Government and contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided wheresoever convicted before Our Trusty and well beloved William Hayward Esq. and others Justices of our provincial Court on Tuesday the Ninth day of April in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy One - Nevertheless We grant unto him our full Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same plight and Condition to all Intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereso he the said Negro Anthony hath been convicted had never been done or committed - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esquire Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over Our said Province this 22nd day of June in the Twenty fifth Year of Our Dominion Anno Domini 1774 -
