Maryland's 2^d Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore To all Persons to whom these presents shall come greeting Whereas Francis Granadam a Native of Germany having Transported himself into this Province here to Inhabit and as a Free Denizen Freedom and Land to him and his Heirs to purchase Know Ye that we willing to give due encouragement to the Subjects of that Nation Do hereby Declare him the said Francis Granadam to be a Free Denizen of this our Province of Maryland and do further for us our Heirs and Successors strictly enjoin constitute ordain and Command that he the said Francis Granadam be in all things held treated reputed and esteemed as one of the faithful People of us our Heirs and Successors born within this our Province of Maryland and likewise any Land Tenements Revenues Services and other Hereditaments whatsoever within our said Province of Maryland may Inherit or otherwise purchase receive take have hold buy or possess and then may occupy and enjoy give sell alien and bequeath as likewise all Liberties and Franchises of this our Province of Maryland freely quietly and peaceably have and possess occupy and enjoy as any of our faithful People born or to be born within our said Province of Maryland without the Lett Molestation vexation Trouble or Grievance of us our Heirs or Successors any Custom to the contrary hereof in anywise notwithstanding Given at Annapolis under the Great Seal of our said Province of Maryland this 22 day of June in the Twenty first Year of our Dominion over the said Province Anno Domini 1774.
