Granadam a Native of Germany having Transported himself into this Province here to Inhabit and
as a Free Denizen Freedom and Land to him and his Heirs to purchase Know ye that we willing
to give due encouragement to the Subjects of that Nation Do hereby Declare him the said Francis
Granadam to be a Free Denizen of this Our Province of Maryland And do further for Us Our
Heirs and Successors strictly enjoin constitute ordain and command that he the said Francis —
Granadam be in all things held treated reputed and esteemed as one of the faithful People of Us
our Heirs and Successors born within this our Province of Maryland and likewise any Land
Tenements Revenues Services and other Hereditaments whatsoever within our said Province of
Maryland may inherit or otherwise purchase receive take have hold buy or possess and then
may occupy and enjoy give sell alien and bequeath as likewise all Liberties and Franchises
of this Our Province of Maryland freely quietly and peaceably have and possess occupy and
enjoy as any of our faithful People Born or to be Born within our said Province of Mary-
land without the least Molestation vexation Trouble or Grievance of us our Heirs or Successors
any custom to the contrary hereof in anywise notwithstanding Given at Annapolis under
the Great Seal of Our said Province of Maryland this 22 day of June in the Twenty first Year
of our Dominion over the said Province Anno Domini 1771. Witness Our Trusty and well
beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq^r Lieutenant General and Chief Governor of our said Pro-
vince of Maryland —

and other Hereditaments whatsoever within our said Province of Maryland may inherit or
otherwise purchase receive take have hold buy or possess and then may occupy and enjoy give
sell alien and bequeath as likewise all Liberties and Franchises of this our Province of Mary-
land freely quietly and peaceably have and possess occupy and enjoy as any of our faithful
People Born or to be Born within our said Province of Maryland without the least Molestation
vexation trouble or Grievance of us our Heirs or Successors any custom to the contrary hereof in
anywise notwithstanding Given at Annapolis under the great Seal of our said Province
of Maryland this 22 day of June in the Twenty first Year of our Dominion Anno Domini
1771. Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esquire Lieutenant Gene-
ral and Chief Governor of our said Province of Maryland.
