Frederick Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To all our Bailiffs and good people to whom these presents shall come greeting. Know Ye that of our Especial Grace We have Pardoned unto Paul Carr late of Frederick County Labourer as a proper Object of our Mercy the Suit of our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that he the said Paul Carr on the Twentieth day of December in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy One at Frederick County aforesaid with Force and Arms and so forth One Gelding of a Black Colour of the price of Twelve pounds current Money of the goods and Chattels of a certain Conrad Lutterer then and there found feloniously did Steal take and Ride away against our Peace good Rule and Government and Contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such Case made and Provided, whereof he was convicted before Joseph Wood Esq. and others Justices of an Especial Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Goal Delivery held in and for Frederick County aforesaid on the Twentieth day of March in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy Two Nevertheless We Grant unto him our firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal Punishment therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same plight and Condition to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the said Felony whereof he the said Paul Carr hath been convicted had never been done or committed. Witness our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over our said Province this eighteenth day of April in the Twenty first Year of our Dominion Anno Domini 1772.

Know Ye that of our Especial Grace We have Pardoned unto Isaac Pemberton late of Baltimore County Carpenter as a proper Object of our Mercy the Suit of our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto Us for that he the said Isaac Pemberton on the fifteenth day of November in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and seventy One between the Hours of Nine and Four in the Night of the same Day with Force and Arms and so forth at the County aforesaid the Dwelling House of a certain Francis Sanderson there situate feloniously and burglariously did break and Enter and One piece of Gold called a Johannes of the value of Three pounds twelve Shillings Sterling Twenty pieces of Gold called Half Johannes of the value of thirty six Shillings Sterling each piece, Five pieces of Gold called English Guineas of the value of Twenty One Shillings Sterling each piece, five pieces of Gold called Half Guineas of the value of Ten Shillings
