

and sixpence each piece, eight paper bills of credit of the Province of Maryland called eight Dollar Bills made to entitle the Bearer thereof to receive Bills of Exchange payable in London at the rate of four Shillings and sixpence Sterling each Dollar for the said Bills according to the directions of an Act of Assembly of the Province of Maryland of the value of thirty six Shillings Sterling each Bill of the goods and Chattels of a certain John Mackin and a certain Richard Lemonson in the said dwelling House then and there being then and there feloniously and burglariously did steal take and carry away against our Peace Good Rule and Government, whereof he was convicted before Benjamin Rogers Esq. and others Justices of an Especial Court of Oyer and Terminer and general Goal Delivery held in and for Baltimore County aforesaid on the Twenty sixth day of February in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy two Nevertheless We grant unto him our firm peace and will not that he suffer any corporal punishment therefor Provided that he the said Isaac Pemberton shall transport himself or cause himself to be transported out of this our Province on or before the last day of May next and never to return again otherwise this our Pardon shall and is hereby declared to be Void and of none Effect anything herein contained to the contrary in anywise Notwithstanding - Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq. Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over our said Province this tenth day of April in the Twenty first Year of our Dominion Anno Domini 1772.

Know Ye that of our Especial Grace we have pardoned and ^{late} the said County Decided) as a proper Object of our Mercy the Suit of our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he the said Negro Tom not having the fear of God before his eyes but being moved and seduced by the Instigation of the Devil on the Twenty second day of December in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy One with Force and Arms at the County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of said County Court in and upon One Negro Man named Duchery in the Peace of God then and there being feloniously wilfully and of his Malice aforesought did make an Assault and that he the said Negro Tom with a certain Knife of the value of Two pence Sterling which he the said Negro Tom in his right Hand then and there had and held the said Negro Duchery in and upon the left Breast under the Nipple of him the said Negro Duchery then and there feloniously wilfully and of his Malice aforesought did strike and thrust giving to the said Negro Duchery then and there with the Knife aforesaid in and upon the abovementioned left Breast under the Nipple of him the said Negro Duchery one Mortal Wound of the Breadth of Two Inches and Depth of six Inches
