Whereas Negro Simus late of An Arundel County Labourer the slave of Samuel & now Esq stands charged for a Felony and Burglary by him committed in Breaking and Entering the Store House of a certain John Lane and stealing and carrying away from thence sundry Goods and Chattels the property of the aforesaid John Lane — I know ye that we of our especial ly and certain Knowledge and mere Motion have pardoned released and discharged and by these presents do pardon Release and discharge to the ~~felony~~ said Negro Simus of An Arundel County aforesaid Labourer or by any other name or Addition or such Mystery or place the said Negro Simus was lately or is now known distinguished or called the Felony and Burglary aforesaid and every the trespass and other Misdeeds in any manner touching or concerning the same and all and every kind of Suit Complaint Action Impeachment and Demand whatsoever which we against the said Negro Simus By reason or occasion of the Promises now or may hereafter have and Prosecution of the peace which to us against the said Negro Simus belongs or hereafter may belong And therefore we give and grant unto the said Negro Simus Our firm peace that we will stay sucease and forbear any Proceedings at Law upon the Felony and Burglary aforesaid by those Presents so that he may stand Right in all Courts if any One against him shall object the Promises or any of them.

Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Brother Robert Eden Esq Lieutenant General and Chief Governor in and over our said Province this 13<sup>th</sup> Day of August in the 22<sup>o</sup> Year of our Dominion Anno Domini 1772 —
