Know Ye that Whereas I have and do repose great Trust and Confidence in your Skill and Art in Surveying of Land & by these presents Do hereby constitute and Appoint you the said Thomas McPherson to be Deputy Surveyor of Charles County to the utmost Bounds and Limits thereof in Surveying or Resurveying any Land in any part of the aforesaid County of Charles in as full and ample manner as any Deputy Surveyor or Deputy Surveyors of the said County have usually done or performed and to Act do and perform the same without any Let Hindrance or Molestations of any Person or Persons whatsoever I have and to hold the said Office of Deputy Surveyor during pleasure. — Hereby granting unto you the said Thomas McPherson Two Third parts of all Fees that shall accrue from the said Office Provided also that you the said Thomas McPherson shall from Time to Time and at all Times hereafter receive and comply with all such Orders and Instructions as I shall under my Hand appoint and direct you. — Given under my Hand and Seal this 24<sup>th</sup> day of September in the Twenty second Year of his Lordship's Dominion Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and Seventy Two. —
