To the Honourable Daniel Dulany of the City of Annapolis Esq. Greeting.

Rob. Eden: We reposing especial Trust and Confidence in the Integrity Care and Circumspection of you the said Daniel Dulany do (by virtue of the Powers given in the Letters Patent from King Charles the First to Laelius Baron of Baltimore his Heirs and Assigns of the said Province of Maryland) by these Presents nominate and appoint you the said Daniel Dulany Secretary of the said Province of Maryland with full Powers and Authority to you the said Daniel Dulany to execute the said Office of Secretary and to do and perform all other Acts usually done by the former Secretaries of the Province aforesaid And We do hereby further empower you the said Daniel Dulany to receive all Perquisites Fees and Advantages whatsoever to the said Office of Secretary belonging or in anywise appertaining in as full and ample manner as any Person or Persons heretofore have held or enjoyed or ought to have hold and enjoy the same To have and to hold exercise and enjoy the said Office and to take and receive all such Fees Perquisites and Advantages as aforesaid unto you the said Daniel Dulany during our Will and pleasure And We do hereby Repeal and make Void and Null all former Commissions for the said Office. — Witness Our Trusty and well beloved Robert Eden Esq.
