of Our Provincial Court in Our Province of Maryland Esq^r Greetings

Rob^r Edens. Out of the Especial Trust and Confidence We have and do
repose in your Fidelity Diligence Circumpection and Prudence
and in your knowledge and Understanding in the Laws of
Great Britain and this Province We have Nominated and by these Presents
do Constitute Ordain and Appoint you the said Thomas Jennings Our Atto-
ney General and Prosecutor of Our Suits Pleas and Actions within Our
Province of Maryland whether Criminal or Civil Real Personal or Mvt or
of what nature or kind soever to be Prosecuted and Attended by yourself in
our Provincial Court of our fair Province of Maryland and in such County
Courts as you shall Practice and by discreet and able Persons as you shall
for that Purpose from time to time appoint or Deputy under you in the several
County Courts of this Province where you do not Practice of which you are
to take due care as much as in your Sies And we do hereby grant that you
and the Persons so Deputed or to be Deputed under you be and are hereby Permitted
and Authorized to demand require and receive to you and their Proper uses and
Behoof all such Salaries Profits Fees and Rewards as now are or hereafter
shall be settled granted or due by Law (that is to say) to yourself what is
allowed in the Provincial Court and all the Courts where your Practice
is to your Deputyes what is allowed in the County Courts And because We would
not that you should want any Assistance Council or Advice in the Man-
agement or Prosecution of your Affairs aforesaid under your Care and
Charge We therefore Enjoin the several Attorneys Practitioners and Coun-
cillors at Law that now are or hereafter shall be appointed and allowed of by us
or Our Governor or Commander in Chief in and over our fair Province or
Admitted to Practice by the Laws thereof to give and Impart to you their
or any of their Council or Assistance in any Matter or Thing as you shall
or may think necessary or requisite for our Service Provided such
Attorneys Practitioners and Councillors at Law are not retained against us
in such Matters as you require their Council Advice or Assistance
in which Case and no other they are to be dispensed. And that you may
be better informed in all Matters and Things that relate to Our Service
either from Evidences or Informers to form your Pleas and Proceedings
